Proposed appeal limited to personal findings against Mr Hurd

In 2013, the Federal Court of Australia delivered judgment in favour of Zomojo against its former director Matthew Hurd, Zeptonics Pty Ltd and other related companies. The Court found that Mr Hurd had taken and used sophisticated technology and confidential information belonging to Zomojo in breach of his legal and ethical obligations and that technology sold by Zeptonics was rightly the property of Zomojo. Zeptonics and other companies subsequently went into liquidation. See our summary here:

Mr Hurd has recently sought leave to appeal the decision of the trial judge in respect of findings made against him personally. Zomojo has submitted to the Court that Mr Hurd should be refused leave as his proposed grounds of appeal are incompetent and have no prospects of success whatsoever. The Court will determine whether Mr Hurd should be granted leave or not at a hearing to take place in early 2015.

Importantly, no appeal has been brought by the now liquidated Zeptonics Pty Ltd and other related companies and the findings against them are final. The technology and products that the Court found was rightly the property of Zomojo cannot be the subject of the proposed appeal. Neither Zomojo's nor Exablaze's customers will be affected in any way by the proposed appeal.
